- Light loving: Thrives in bright, indirect light and medium light. Doesn't like low light.
- Moderate water needs: Prefers evenly moist soil but does not tolerate sitting in water.
 Allow the top layer of soil to dry slightly between waterings. Performs beautifully in controlled-watering systems such as self-watering pots (we sell these!) or sub-irrigated planters.
- Reliable Year-Round Appeal: A moderate grower that stays consistently lush with minimal pruning—simply remove aging fronds at the base to maintain shape and density
- **Versatile Styling:** Works well as a standalone statement piece in a decorative container or paired with low-growing underplantings such as pothos or philodendron for a layered tropical display.
- Size: We sell these in 3 gallon, 5 gallon and 7 gallon sizes and they range in size from smaller 3–4 ft plants to mature 8–10 ft indoor specimens. Indoors they will typically top out around 8–10 ft, developing new multi-stemmed shoots over time for a fuller appearance.

Additional Information:

The Chamaedorea seifrizii (Bamboo Palm) is a graceful, clumping, evergreen palm known for its reed-like canes and soft, pinnate leaves. Its slim, bamboo-like stems grow in dense clusters, giving it a vertical, natural "thicket" appearance that brings lush tropical texture indoors. The foliage is made up of narrow, feathered leaflets that create a light, airy canopy.

This palm is well-loved for its ability to thrive indoors with relatively low light and moderate moisture, making it ideal for offices, commercial interiors, and residential spaces alike. It stays medium-sized compared to many palms, generally reaching 6–10 ft indoors, and its clustered form allows it to serve as either a room accent or a natural privacy screen.

Native to Mexico and Central America, Chamaedorea seifrizii naturally grows in the understory of tropical forests, which explains its tolerance for shade and its preference for evenly moist but well-drained soil. West Coast Nurseries is the only grower in Hawaii, and there are no growers in California growing this beautiful palm either.

Grower's tip:

Overwatering is the most common issue. Keep the soil lightly moist but never soggy, and ensure proper drainage. In lower light, the plant will drink more slowly, so extend the time between waterings. Brown leaf tips are often a sign of fluoride or salt sensitivity — using filtered or distilled water can help keep fronds looking pristine.

Pairs well with: Pothos, philodendron, dieffenbachia, and other moisture-compatible tropical underplantings that don't get very tall.
