- Versatile use: Works beautifully as a stand-alone feature in a decorative pot or paired with low underplantings such as pothos or philodendron for added depth and texture.
- Size: We sell these in a wide range of sizes from compact 3-foot specimens to mature 12-foot statement palms. Indoors, it rarely exceeds 12–14 feet, focusing instead on producing new shoots that widen the plant's base for a fuller look.

**Grower's tip:** This is a revered plant for its hardiness and most problems occur because the plant gets overwatered and are not given time to dry out between waterings. Remember that

photosynthesis slows in a darker space and the plant will be slower to take up the water. This means allowing a few extra days between waterings.

**Additional Information:** The Lady Palm is an extremely hearty evergreen fan palm that grows in a dense cluster of slender, upright, bamboo-like canes with fan shaped leaf stalks. The foliage is best known for its broad fan-shaped leaves that each divide into 5-8 finger-like segments. These are slow growing palms that will maintain a consistent appearance when placed indoors and can range from 3 feet to upwards of 12 feet, given enough time. Rhapis Excelsa creates a unique jungle feel due to the dense, green foliage.

Medium water needs and can thrive in a variety of light conditions. This makes it a great choice for the dark, cozy corner of a house or office that needs a splash of 'jungle' or a great addition to a commercial space such as an airport or mall to create a natural hedge with easy maintenance. Can be used as a standalone plant due to its dense layering of palm leaves.

The genus name, Rhapis is Greek for "Rod" or "Needle" and Excelsa means "tall" although this is not the tallest of the plants in the genus. It is native to southern China but may no longer exist in the wild.

Pairs well with: pothos or philodendron
