**Additional Information:**

Pothos Green Queen is one of the most resilient foliage plants available. It tolerates a wide range of conditions and typically experiences minimal pest issues. In rare cases, spider mites or mealybugs may appear, but routine care and inspection keep the plant thriving.






**Grower’s tip:**

- Remove from grow pot and place directly into a planter or a larger pot for better moisture retention and you won’t have to water it as often
- Trim vines regularly to encourage fuller growth
- Can be propagated easily from cuttings in water
- Performs best in medium to high light but can tolerate low light
- Allow soil to dry slightly between waterings

**Pairs well with:**

Zamioculcas zamiifolia, Aglaonema, Philodendron, compact palms, and dracaena varieties that contrast nicely with its trailing form.
